# Our Beneficiary Nelson Matos



Nelson is a 18-year-old from Nutley, New Jersey. Nelson originally went to the hospital in January of last year with abdominal pain. Upon further testing it was discovered that he had an enlarged heart and his heart was not pumping sufficient blood and it was determined that Nelson's heart had reached end stage heart failure and would be needing a heart transplant. The doctors determined that Nelson would need a left ventricular assist device.

Unfortunately Nelson suffered a stroke after having the device implanted with clots lodging in both hemispheres of his brain. The stroke left Nelson with very little movement in his right side and partial movement on his left side. Because of this Nelson is no longer a candidate for a heart transplant due to the mobility needed for him to rehab after the surgery. Nelson is currently fighting to rehab himself and gain the needed mobility to be able to go back on the heart

transplant list. It has been a long road but Nelson is a fighter and he is planning to recover and get his new heart.

#### **Director's Note**

Where there is love and hope, a community is built. Godspell at its core tells the story of just this. Set in a community garden beginning with philosophers from Socrates to Thomas Aquinas, each sharing their teachings but never connecting the story until John the Baptist calls this group of individuals together and baptizes them. Following Jesus' arrival and his baptism by John, the community that has begun to form is further taught by Jesus through parables from the book of Mark. In this growing garden, the community learns and grows together, embracing lessons of forgiveness, acceptance, and perseverance.

The visualization of a group of complete strangers forming close bonds and growing together often mirrors what we hope for in our daily lives. In a world where a strong sense of community and acceptance is something we are always striving to find and build upon, stories like this offer hope and comfort. It demonstrates the need for support and forgiveness. And how individuals who come together with shared purpose then find comfort within that supportive and understanding community.

The individuals on and off stage, along with everyone surrounding this production, have come together to create a community together in a similar light to that in the story of Godspell. We have a unique group of individuals each at different crossroads in their lives varying in age and life experiences, that have come together to form a beautiful community of our own. Everyone has contributed their perspectives and talents to support and lift up one another and have created and maintained a supportive and accepting environment. This sense of community extends beyond the performances themselves. Every effort has been dedicated to supporting Nelson, with each person involved contributing to this shared sense of purpose to the true reason we are here.

Words truly cannot express how incredible the experience of directing this show has been. Taking on such a project for the first time was intimidating, but with the unwavering support and constant collaboration of everyone involved, this journey has become something unparalleled. This cast and crew holds so much talent and creativity. Each person has played a crucial role in creating what you see today. Their dedication went beyond personal gain; they poured their hearts and souls into this all, for Nelson. They have brick by brick built this show and this summer into something completely beautiful.

To everyone who contributed to making our efforts to support Nelson a success, your generosity and support have been invaluable. Thank you for helping us bring this beautiful show to life.

#### President's Note

"We can build a beautiful city."

This lyric from the song "Beautiful City" is one that really resonates when thinking about this summer. The story of Godspell is a story of strangers becoming a community. These individuals learn and grow together, supporting and uplifting one another's voices. This is the story told in Godspell; however, this is also what has happened this summer off-stage. For some, this summer has been their first experience with this organization; for others, it was a time to reconnect with old friends, enjoy another summer with the organization, build new connections, make art, and do good. Whatever the reason, every single person came together this year to create something beautiful in support of our beneficiary, Nelson. Our community has grown this year through the talents and hearts of all those involved.

Seventy-three years ago, when a young man named Charles Seller was injured in a train accident, the community around him came together to put on a variety show called "Talent Time." The Talent Time Players, as they are now known, came together to build the show through writing music, making costumes, building sets, and, of course, performing on stage. They all came together with the same end goal: helping Charlie. Following the support he received, Charlie donated some of the money raised for him back, with the intention of continuing the kindness shown to him. It is through his generosity that this tradition has continued to support those in need, seventy-four years later.

Earlier this year, our community was heartbroken to learn of the passing of Charles Seller. I wanted to share a quote from Charlie from our organization's 70th Anniversary Documentary that demonstrates the person he was and his outlook on the organization: "There's a phrase that's become very current in recent years—called paying it forward. I think I had been so gratified by how good people were to me that from the start I found myself wanting to do what I now think paying it forward means. You won't necessarily know these people; it won't matter. What matters is whatever your situation becomes, wherever you are, pay it forward in ways that can be sensitive to people's needs and helpful to them."

He described the organization as something that provided younger people with something productive, interesting, and fun to do. Keeping this in the forefront of our minds, we will work to continue this tradition and organization in Charlie's memory.

From that moment back in 1950 and through Charlie's generosity, The Charles Seller Foundation and Talent Time Players were born. And still, seventy-four years later, the community that surrounds this organization comes together every year with the goal of helping a member of our community. Our beneficiary this year is Nelson Matos, an eighteen-year-old from Nutley, New Jersey. Nelson was diagnosed with end-stage heart failure last year and required a left ventricular assist device (LVAD). After the device was implanted, Nelson suffered a stroke that caused significant loss of movement on the right side of his body and partial movement on the left. This has made him ineligible for a heart transplant, as he needs to regain mobility for post-surgery rehabilitation. Despite these challenges, Nelson is determined to rehabilitate and eventually return to the transplant list.

To our Board of Trustees, thank you for ensuring that this amazing organization continues to help others for generations to come. To our Advisory Board—Jim, Abby, Tracey, Ralph, Courtney, KG, and Johnny—thank you for your continued advice, support, and guidance throughout this past year. You continue to help us all strive to do the best that we can for this organization. To the rest of the Executive Board—Caitlin, Toniann, Katelyn, Julia, and Azael—this year would not have been possible without any of you. Thank you for being there every step of the way to ensure that our membership felt supported by the Executive Board, that things were done effectively and efficiently and for giving this year everything you could. You all have brought such an amazing spirit and energy into this year.




